

2024 PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARY RECAP

With the election certification and audit complete, the first of four elections in 2024 is officially in the books for Pasco County. Overall, the Presidential Preference Primary was a very smooth election, although the turnout was lower than previous election cycles. With only one candidate remaining in the race for US President and Florida's primary after Super Tuesday, we saw only 31,472 votes cast which equates to nearly 20% of registered Republicans who participated in this election.

We now turn our attention to six municipal elections on April 9^{th.} Per Florida law, my office conducts the elections for the cities of Dade City, New Port Richey, Zephyrhills, San Antonio, Port Richey, and the town of St. Leo.

Once we wrap up the six municipal elections next week, we will begin preparing for candidate qualifying followed by the Primary Election on August 20th, and the General Election on November 5th.
